EDUCATION:

Exciting news! Emily Howland has been accepted for induction in the Woman's Hall of Fame in Seneca Falls in 2021. After several applications by HSSM, her accomplishments will now be recognized. Further information on the inauguration will follow when announced.

The Education committee is developing planned displays for Opendore and the Stone Store.

OPENDORE PROJECT:

Work continues at Opendore by our dedicated group of volunteers, who have logged over 8,400 hours since Fall 2016.

Our primary focus is interior trim restoration, which involves careful reconstruction of salvage trim and recreation of new components to replace those that were not able to be salvaged. Most of the 2nd floor of the 1910 North wing has now been restored.

Additionally, we have received a group of new interior doors for the stairwell, Archive Room, restrooms, and Foyer. These are now being installed by volunteers.

Our handicapped accessible interior lift from the first to second floor is now operational, making the building fully accessible.

And we now have Verizon Wi-Fi in the building, to be used for broadcasting programs as well as other functions.

GRANTS:

- HSSM is one of this year's Preserve New York grantees. A \$10,000 Preserve New York grant will enable
 HSSM to develop a Historic Landscape Report through consultant Jean Gleisner. The Preservation
 League of NYS and their program partners at the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) are
 thrilled to help fund this important work. The Preserve New York grant program is a partnership
 between the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) and the Preservation League, made possible
 with the support of Governor Andrew M. Cuomo and the New York State Legislature.
